NEW YORK STATE DREAM ACT: KEY POINTS

- Allows undocumented students attending college in NY State to apply for state-funded aid (TAP)
- One single application for all scholarships
- Allows undocumented students to qualify for Excelsior Scholarship
- Application and User Guide are now available on HESC website

NEW YORK STATE DREAM ACT

Requirements for Eligibility

In order to qualify for the NYS Dream Act,

If you live in NYS, you must have one of the following:

- U-Visa
- T-Visa
- Deferred Enforced Departure
- Temporary Protected Status
- Without lawful status (includes DACA)

NEW YORK STATE DREAM ACT

Educational Requirements for Eligibility

AND you either

- Attend an **undergraduate program within five years** of receiving a NYS high school diploma
- OR, attend a **graduate program within ten years** of receiving a NYS high school diploma
- OR, received a **NYS high school equivalency diploma** (TASC/GED)
- OR, student is charged the **NYS resident in-State tuition rate** at a SUNY or CUNY college for any reason

NOTE: ELIGIBILITY FOR THE NYSDA REQUIRES YOU TO MEET ONE OF FOUR REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL TIPS FOR COMPLETING THE APPLICATION

1. If student is undocumented or their parents are undocumented, they should remove the street address and any parent names visible on the documentation
2. For a high school equivalency program graduate, the HSE ID needs to be clearly present
3. Unofficial transcripts can be used with full name visible, but it should show full grades. If the graduation year is not marked clearly on a transcript, a copy of the diploma may be necessary
4. Multiple files should be uploaded as a .ZIP file

5. Acceptable types include -- **.pdf, .tif, .png, .jpeg, .jpg, .bmp and .xps**

7. Students will receive emails from two (2) possible ISTS email addresses. Both should be added to the contacts so that they don't go to spam

Excelsior Scholarship Details

You are applying for the **Excelsior Spring 2020 Scholarship**. This application is for students looking to receive a **first-time Excelsior award for the spring 2020 term**. The New York State Excelsior Scholarship program enables eligible students from families who earn up to \$125,000 a year to attend a SUNY or CUNY college tuition free. Recipients receive award payments for up to two years of continuous full-time study in a program leading to an associate's degree or four years of continuous full-time study leading to a bachelor's degree, or five years if the program of study normally requires five years. Don't forget, if you accept the award, you must complete 30 credit hours towards your program of study each year and agree to live and work, if employed, in New York State for the length of time you received the award. Failure to meet these requirements will result in the conversion of your award to a no-interest loan. Please note, if you are already a recipient of an Excelsior Scholarship from a previous application period, you do not need to complete this application. You are a recipient if you signed and submitted the Excelsior Scholarship contract, even if you did not receive payment in the prior term. If you still have a pending application from the Fall 2019 term, you should contact HESC at NYS DREAM@applyISTS.com to determine the cause.



FILLING OUT THE FAFSA

Why do it?



- Students who are not eligible for Federal Aid, depending on their process, should still fill out FAFSA
- Submitting FAFSA gets you a Student Aid Report (SAR), which can be used to apply for scholarships or institutional aid
- If non-eligible student receives any aid, they should return it immediately




FILLING OUT THE FAFSA

Challenges

- Undocumented students and their families may not have SS numbers to file a FAFSA
- They may be fearful of reporting their tax / financial information because of their immigration status
- Many families do pay taxes via ITIN numbers assigned by the IRS, others do not or have inaccuracies within their past tax reports

*Recommend a printed copy




FILLING OUT THE FAFSA

DACA Students



- If a DACA student *does* have a SSN, they should include it with their application
- Fill out FAFSA form as early as possible
- **Ask parents to request IRS transcript**



FILLING OUT THE FAFSA

Students with Undocumented Parents


- **Enter all zeros for parent's SSN** – do not use an ITIN
- Parents should sign printed form rather than use four-digit PIN electronic signature
- Request transcript from IRS before filling out
- If parents do not have an ITIN, they can apply for one using W7 form found on *irs.gov* or by calling 311
- We have never heard of a family being deported due to filling out the FAFSA form



ALTERNATIVES TO FEDERAL AID

- State-administered funding through New York State Dream Act
- Many scholarships are open to students regardless of immigration status – some are created especially for undocumented students!
